1. Landscape Ontario Funding Application

WHEREAS the Town of Halton Hills has an interest in protecting and enhancing biodiversity and resilient green infrastructure as outlined in Council's Strategic Plan, and supporting climate change adaptation per the Town's Climate Change Adaptation Plan;

AND WHEREAS Landscape Ontario is undertaking the "Stormwater Management and Green Infrastructure Project" which will contribute to flood mitigation, create habitat through naturalization and native trees, provide accessible public recreational opportunities, and become an innovative educational tool for broader green infrastructure application;

AND WHEREAS Landscape Ontario has committed to partnering with the Town on other initiatives that will benefit the broader community, such as:

- Greening public spaces
- Encouraging economic growth and collaborating with local businesses
- Engaging local schools and youth in educational programming
- Supporting tree planting projects
- Promoting Halton Hills as tourist destination

AND WHEREAS Landscape Ontario has indicated that it is willing to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with the Town of Halton Hills to outline the terms of this partnership;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Town of Halton Hills Council acknowledges that Landscape Ontario is applying for a funding opportunity from the Federation of Canadian Municipalities' Local Leadership for Climate Adaptation initiative for "Stormwater Management and Green Infrastructure Project at Landscape Ontario's Halton Hills Training Facility", in partnership with the Town of Halton Hills;

AND FURTHER THAT Council direct Town staff to work with Landscape Ontario staff, while recognizing limited Town resources, to draft a Memorandum of Understanding in order to confirm each party's

commitment to the partnership, and report back to Council for final approval, should the Federation of Canadian Municipalities' Local Leadership for Climate Adaptation grant be successfully received by Landscape Ontario;

AND FURTHER THAT Council also recognizes that the lifetime maximum projects, based on Halton Hills' population, from the Adaptation in Action funding stream is two (2) Implementation Projects – as the Lead Municipality, if this project is approved, it would count as one of the two Implementation Projects under this limit.

2. Vision Georgetown District Energy

WHEREAS district energy systems and alternative energy sources have long been identified as potential components within the Vision Georgetown planning area, reflecting Council's commitment to environmental stewardship and long-term sustainability;

AND WHEREAS recent technical work undertaken by Dillon Consulting on behalf of the Southwest Georgetown Landowners Group concludes that the Vision Georgetown area does not possess the necessary critical mass to support a district energy system without substantial public investment and significant financial risk;

AND WHEREAS this work fulfils the requirement in the Vision Georgetown Secondary Plan (OPA 32) for landowners to examine the feasibility of district energy within the Community Core;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT staff be directed not to pursue district energy or other area-wide alternative energy systems within the Community Core, and that the related Secondary Plan requirement be deemed satisfied at the Block Plan stage;

AND FURTHER THAT staff work collaboratively with the Southwest Georgetown Landowners Group through the Block Plan and individual Draft Plan of Subdivision processes to identify practical, market-driven, site-specific opportunities to support energy efficiency, low-carbon technologies, and other achievable environmental measures on a voluntary basis;

AND FURTHER THAT staff be directed to engage with the Southwest Georgetown Landowners Group and report back to Council on the potential reallocation of remaining District Energy funds, originally set aside by the landowners, toward the investigation or advancement of future public facilities such as a hospital campus, or similar community-serving uses, to be determined through ongoing discussions.

3. Conservation Authorities Amalgamation

WHEREAS the Province of Ontario has posted Environmental Registry of Ontario (ERO) Posting #025-1257 proposing the consolidation of Ontario's 36 Conservation Authorities into 7 Regional Conservation Authorities; with oversight and administration by a provincial board;

AND WHEREAS the proposed Western Lake Ontario Regional Conservation Authority would consolidate Credit Valley Conservation with Conservation Halton, Hamilton Conservation Authority, and Niagara Peninsula Conservation Authority, resulting in significant changes affecting the corporation and residents of Halton Hills in relation to governance, service delivery, financial structures, land management, and municipal oversight;

AND WHEREAS our local conservation authorities provide legislated planning and engineering services which allow development to occur and whose costs are covered by both local property taxpayers and the development industry;

AND WHEREAS the Credit River and its tributaries (the watershed), including Black Creek, Bovis Creek, Fairy Lake, Silver Creek as well as Sixteen Mile Creek are highly valued by our residents and our conservation authorities monitor the health of the watershed and help manage, adapt and mitigate changes which threaten our drinking water sources, effects such as flooding and environmental degradation;

AND WHEREAS our local conservation authorities manage publicly owned recreational land which are significant local greenspaces with opportunities ranging from ski hills to hiking trails to beaches and lake - based recreation and indigenous and outdoor education;

AND WHEREAS the funding for local conservation authority property and program operations rests primarily with local property taxpayers with provincial funding being, typically, less than 5% of annual budgets;

AND WHEREAS the proposed consolidation and provincial oversight board raises substantial risks related to local decision-making authority, municipal representation, transition funding, asset ownership, alignment with other provincial reforms, and the protection of local programs, community services, and public greenspace;

AND WHEREAS Halton Hills is served by high-performing conservation authorities with established excellence in regulatory compliance, watershed science, digital modernization, municipal partnership, and service delivery, and therefore any provincial restructuring must protect and build upon these strengths;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Council of the Town of Halton Hills affirms that any provincial restructuring of conservation authorities must:

- Preserve meaningful municipal governance and local decision-making;
- Protect CA land ownership and public access to greenspace;
- Provide full provincial funding, not local property tax, for any transition costs and for the operational costs of an Ontario Provincial Conservation Agency;
- Maintain uninterrupted delivery of critical watershed and public safety functions; and

- Recognize and safeguard the performance and capacity of high-functioning, high-performing conservation authorities such as those served by the Town of Halton Hills.

AND FURTHER THAT the province considers whether modernization and objectives for province-wide consistency can be achieved in a more efficient and effective manner;

AND FURTHER THAT this resolution be submitted to the Environmental Registry of Ontario in response to Posting #025-1257, Proposed Boundaries for the Regional Consolidation of Ontario's Conservation Authorities; and circulated to Conservation Ontario and its members, Ontario upper and lower tier municipalities, Halton MPP's, Ontario Provincial Party Leaders.
