4. SCHEDULED ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION

4.a Research and Evaluation Report - 9709 Fifth Line

L. Loney provided an overview of the research and evaluation report for the property located at 9709 Fifth Line (Halton Hills). It meets 5 of 9 criteria for designation. It is a representative example of a late-19th century Gothic Revival farmhouse. It displays a high degree of craftsmanship and artistic merit. It is associated with the Fisher, Hume, and Wilson families. It has remained in its original location for over 130 years and is contextually significant. For these reasons staff recommend designation.

This property was deferred from a previous meeting to address the owners' concerns about future use of the property.

Recommendation No. HHH-2026-0005

THAT Heritage Halton Hills recommend Council issue a Notice of Intention to Designate for the property at 9709 Fifth Line for designation under the *Ontario Heritage Act*.

4.b Research and Evaluation Report - 121 Mountainview Road North (Georgetown)

L. Loney provided an overview of the research and evaluation report for the property located at 121 Mountainview Road North (Georgetown). It meets 5 of 9 criteria for designation. It is a representative example of a vernacular Italianate residential building. It is associated with John A. Willoughby, Levi Edward Fleck, and his family, as well as the paper coating industry in Georgetown. It is linked to its surroundings and serves as a landmark along Mountainview Road North. The property owner is supportive of designation. For these reasons staff recommend designation.

L. Loney requested committee input on whether the porches should be included as part of the designation. The committee supported inclusion of the porches as part of the designation.

Recommendation No. HHH-2026-0006

THAT Heritage Halton Hills recommend Council issue a Notice of Intention to Designate for the property at 121 Mountainview Road North for designation under the *Ontario Heritage Act*.
